What Is a Water Softener?

A water softener is a water-treatment system designed to reduce hardness-causing minerals in water. Traditional ion-exchange water softeners use resin media to exchange hardness ions, primarily calcium and magnesium, with sodium or potassium ions.

The result is softened water that can help reduce mineral scale associated with hard water.

A **Water Softener** may be installed as part of a home's water-treatment setup, typically where the incoming water supply can be treated before it reaches household fixtures and appliances.

Why Consider a Home Water Softener?

Hard water can create several everyday household challenges.

Reduced Scale Buildup

Hard-water minerals can accumulate on faucets, shower fixtures, pipes and appliances. Softening the water can help reduce this type of mineral scale.

Better Soap Performance

Softened water can improve the performance of soaps and detergents because hardness minerals are reduced.

Household Appliances

Mineral deposits can affect appliances that regularly use water. A suitable water-softening system can help reduce scale formation.

Easier Cleaning

Hard-water deposits can leave spots or residue on bathroom fixtures, glass and other surfaces. Softened water can make some cleaning tasks easier.

As the resin becomes saturated with hardness minerals, the system enters a regeneration cycle. A concentrated salt solution is commonly used during regeneration to restore the resin's ability to exchange hardness ions.

The exact operating process can vary depending on the type and design of the system.
